For Grown-Ups to Ask Kids:

Who in your class or neighborhood seems a little different, like the Herdmans? What do you think makes them unique?

Have you ever felt like you didn't fit in, just like the Herdmans? How did it make you feel, and what did you do?

What are some ways we can show kindness to people who seem different from us?



For Kids to Ask Grown-Ups:

Did you ever know someone like the Herdmans when you were a kid? How did you get along with them?

What's something you learned from someone who seemed different from you at first?

What advice would you give me about being a good friend?

For Grown-Ups to Ask Kids:

What are three of your favorite things, and why are they special to you?

2

If you had to give one of your favorite things to someone in need, how would you feel about it?

3

What's one way you can use your favorite things—like your talents, toys, or time—to worship God?



For Kids to Ask Grown-Ups:

1

What is something you treasure now but would have been willing to give up as a kid?

2

Can you remember a time when you gave something up that was important to you? How did it feel?

3

If you were going to bring a gift to baby Jesus, like the wise men did, what would you bring and why?

For Grown-Ups to Ask Kids:

1

Can you think of a time when you felt broken or made a mistake but were forgiven? How did that feel?

2

What's one way you can show love and kindness to someone who feels left out or different, like the Herdmans in the story?

3

What does it mean to be part of God's family? How does knowing that God loves you no matter what make you feel?



For Kids to Ask Grown-Ups:

1

Can you share a time when you made a mistake and were forgiven? What did that teach you about love and grace?

How do you worship God in your everyday life? What are some ways I can do that too?

3

Why do you think it's important to remember that Jesus came for everyone, no matter who they are or what they've done?

For Grown-Ups to Ask Kids:

What's your favorite part about Christmas? Is it the presents, decorations, or something else?

2

Why do you think God chose Mary, who wasn't rich or famous, to be the mother of Jesus?

3

Why do you think prayer is important? What are some things you like to talk to God about?



For Kids to Ask Grown-Ups:

What's your favorite Christmas memory? Why is it so special to you?

2

Why do you think God chose to send Jesus to Earth as a baby instead of someone powerful or important?

3

Can you think of a time when you had to trust God, even when you were scared or didn't understand everything?
